Treasurer Report

Dear Members, Assalamu Alaikum

Having assumed office in April 2019, please see below an update on the financial health of the SLIA. The finances relating to the building and charity are covered in separate reports.

Events update

I am happy to report that we have achieved breakeven on all events we hosted this year.

- The four Iftars held early this year, were funded by member contributions in either providing the food or contributing towards the cost. The hall costs were met from association funds.
- The Eid-ul- fitr function held at the Novotel hotel was a sell out and we are pleased to state that all costs incurred were recovered through ticket sales and contributions. In addition we were able to raise £1700 towards charity funds on this occasion.
- We very much regret that the Eid-ul-Adha function was not held this year despite our efforts to arrange one. The main reasons for not doing so were because of not finding a suitable hall within the affordable price range, the reduced number of members likely to attend given the end of summer holidays and the bank holiday weekend, and the potential risk of financial loss if only a small number attended the function.
- The most recent event, held at the Harrow mosque, was the Meelad celebrations. We had over 160 participants and the cost of the event was £1,560. Alhamdulillah, we achieved breakeven on this occasion due to the generosity of our members. May the blessing of Allah and our dear Prophet be on all those who contributed to this event and to all those graced the event.

This year we have collected approximately £1900 from membership subscriptions. You will appreciate that this is our only source of funds to finance all of our association activities. The rising costs of hall hire, food, stationery, postage, printing, audit fees, web site maintenance, just to mention a few far outstrips the income we receive. Building Sub-Committee Report

Current Status

The lease on the SLIA building in Hanwell, has been Surrendered by the Tenant, bringing an end to the Tenancy which had been in place since August 2013. The Tenant concluded the Tenancy, by settling all rent arrears detailed at the AGM, and a further 3 months rent whilst negotiations continued.

Alhamdhulillah, The SLIA has taken over the keys to the centre in Hanwell, and has recently got the legal clearance from the land registry to be able to re-let the premises. We are in the process of a clean-up prior to marketing and InshaAllah, letting it out once again. A local Entrepreneur-group has shown interest & has met with us, but we await more detailed proposals and/or will be marketing the property via agents, in the open market.

Charity Sub-Committee Report

All praise to the Almighty Allah, the Beneficent, the Merciful.

Ramadan Appeal:



Alhamdulillah, in April SLIA transferred **GBP 6,697** (LKR 1,502,037.10) to our local partner, VOSD, to provide dry rations and Zakath-al-Fitr packs to feed **200** poor and needy families in Hijrapuram & Neeraviputti in Mullaitivu. SLIA also transferred **GBP 9,589** (LKR 2,199,184.80) to a local volunteer, Hassan Ariff, to buy dry rations to make up food parcels for **320** poor and needy families in Hambantota town and suburbs, and provide Khanji for 10 days in Tsunami Village, Hambantota.

Unfortunately, the April terrorist attack led to police prohibiting large gatherings of Muslims in certain districts, therefore VOSD had to change the location of distribution from Mullaitivu to Puttalam, where many poor Muslim IDPs from the North remain after the end of the civil war. SLIA received a completion report from VOSD on the Ramadan distribution in Puttalam.

Hambantota police had also prohibited mass gatherings during Ramadan. The budgeted LKR 75,000 and the LKR 41,585 exchange rate gain were given to the Hambantota mosque for Khanji distributions as these were permitted. The balance LKR 2,082,600 of SLIA funds were deposited into the client A/C of Numerix Pvt Ltd (accountants in Colombo) at Standard Chartered Bank, to be held for future SLIA food distribution projects.

Easter Sunday Bomb Victims:

An SLIA team participated in the ASICS Virgin Sport 10km run in central London on 10th July to raise money for the Sri Lankan Easter Sunday bomb victims (see

article). This is in addition to the £1,705 raised at the American Auction at the SLIA Eid al Fitr event on 16th June 2019. The Charity sub-committee are looking into two UK registered charities, BUDS and AEDU in Batticaloa , that meet the required Charity Commission due diligence standards, as being suitable recipients of these funds. Neeravipitty Education Project:

As we could not find a suitable building in Neeravipitty to purchase and administer through a trust, the subcommittee has looked into alternative education initiatives for the £22,500 set aside for this project. We are still committed to the vision of an initiative that allows SLIA participation in volunteer schemes so that the younger SLIA members maintain links with our Sri Lankan Muslim heritage. We have invited Muslim education-related charities in Sri Lanka to submit suitable project proposals.

In addition, two Charity Sub-Committee members who participated in a World Forum for Sri Lankan Muslims conference in October at the Marriot Hotel, Regents Park, reported on the following assessment by educational experts from Sri Lanka. The increase in the number of Muslim boys in unskilled labour jobs correlated with an increase in drug dependency among Muslim boys and over-representation of young Muslim men in the Colombo prison population. The drop in aspirations means these young men are rejected as suitable marriage partners for Muslim girls, who have higher educational aspirations for themselves and their future families. We are currently looking into an afterschool tuition initiative for Muslim youth in Colombo to try to halt this worrying trend for Muslim boys.

Muslim Aid/Syria Project:

The balance funds of £4,993 from the Muslim Aid Walk for Syria were due to be donated to a Muslim Aid Prosthetic Limbs project in Syria for the victims of the civil war bombing. However, Muslim Aid advised that they had discontinued this project and at their request the funds were donated to Muslim Aid's mother and baby health clinics, helping Syrian refugees residing in refugee camps in Lebanon.

SLIA Communications

The SLIA Comms team aims to promote our community news, increase the profile of our SLIA and inform the community of the extra work our ExCo are doing for the SLIA for example through raising funds for charities and developments on our building. We aim to primarily communicate to our SLIA members and also interested readers and external related organisations. We have also increased and aim to improve content on our ways of communicating through email, SMS, Facebook, our website, WhatsApp, Instagram, Twitter and LinkedIn.

This year we are focussing on 3 main areas to improve the fundamentals of our communications strategy.

1. Improving our GDPR compliance

The team have completed a process of moving all SLIA related files and programs to be stored via the Cloud. This takes important SLIA files off personal computers and makes it secure and accessible by all the ExCo team for future generations. To complement this, we have also began using 'slia.org.uk' email addresses for correspondence which will ensure SLIA material can be stored securely and accessible for future reference if needed.

2. Membership accuracy

The team are in process of analysing our existing records for members and ensuring they are accurate. This will be an ongoing process with the eventual goal to move towards self-maintenance for our members via our website.

3. Communication to our members – Move to WhatsApp

One of the more popular ways of communicating with our members has been via our text message service. Whilst this has proved effective, we now aim to enhance this service and save further costs to the SLIA through moving this service to WhatsApp. Over the coming weeks you will receive a message asking if you still would like to receive notifications from us and that we will be moving our service to WhatsApp. This will have a number of advantages including speed of notifications to our members which can be particularly beneficial in cases of janaza notices and also enable us to send poster notifications of our future events. Of course, for members who do not have WhatsApp they can still receive notification via our traditional text service. Watch this space..
